Greetings to all respectful participants!

It is a great pleasure to welcome all of you to The Front Lines of Sexual Exploitation webinar.

Human trafficking is one of serious issues in Asia. International Labor Organization (ILO) has reported in 2016 there are more than 40 million victims of human trafficking in the world and they are often exploited as sexual victims, forced labors, child soldiers or involved with organ trades and other crimes. Accounting of sexual exploitation which has been reported is 60% of the total. It is recognized not only as a domestic crime, but also as a transnational crime, and is one of the wide-ranging issues, which countries need to work together to deal with.

RfP Japan has launched Taskforce Team to prevent and work for the issue from perspectives of multi-faith communities since April 2020. Taskforce Team learned from the expertise on crucial issues of human trafficking, such as sexual exploitation and forced labors.

In addition to forced prostitution, there are also new forms of sexual exploitation, such as forced marriage, forced pornography, and cases of using Internet chat rooms. The problem is especially serious in Asia.

In this occasion, we, Taskforce Team, decided to carry out an online shelter visit centered in Philippines about sexual exploitation in order to raise public awareness and consider concrete actions to combat human trafficking.

In this online shelter visit, we will learn about the current situation of sexual exploitation and discuss concrete actions to be taken in the future, with the cooperation of the International Justice Mission, a support organization addressing sexual exploitation in the Philippines, in collaboration with the WCRP/RfP Philippines. This is the first online bilateral joint project that will be launched between RfP Japan and /RfP Philippines.

We look forward to a fruitful learning exchange grounded in our joint mission of advancing common action for peace.
